GLASGOW has been named as one of the top cities in the UK – for residents to leave.

The city was placed third after Birmingham and Belfast for enquiries about emigrating to another country, particularly Australia and New Zealand.

Emigration Group director Paul Arthur said: "We have had thousands of enquiries over the last year from people looking to migrate to Australia and New Zealand.

"The economic growth being experienced by both Australia and New Zealand is going to increase this migration further and I expect to see a lot more Glasgow residents moving Down

Under over the next year. Sectors such as manufacturing and construction are on their knees in the UK, but Australia and New Zealand are still demanding the skills Brits have to offer.

"In Glasgow, we have seen many emigrants with trade, mining or manufacturing backgrounds looking to head Down Under."
